

From the Pastor

After the Good Friday service a few weeks ago, in the darkness and quiet, Jake Lara sought me out and presented me with a beautiful colored pencil sketch he had drawn of Jesus on the cross. (See Jake's artwork on page 3 of this Echo, and look for the original hanging on my office door. Thanks, Jake!)

This work of art, drawn by Jake, got me to thinking about our Christian life and what we have to offer for the good of God's people. When we think about what we can offer for God's kingdom, usually two things come to mind. First, we think that everyone can and should offer an "offering," a monetary gift, a tithe, 10% of our income, to support the Lord's work. While this is true, it is far from inclusive in how we can offer ourselves to the Lord's service. The second thing people think of when it comes to how to serve the Lord is going into full-time professional church work. Some are called to this wonderful work, and if you are sensing the Lord's guidance to direct you toward ministry in the church, please talk to me! This is a great blessing! However, full-time church work and bringing financial offerings are only two of the nearly countless ways that we all can serve the Lord for the good of His people in the church. Jake's drawing points that out.

Outside of financial stewardship, God has given all of us a host of additional talents to use for the good of His church and His people. How will you put your gifts and abilities to work for Gods' glory? Jake has a gift of artistic talent, and he is sharing that gift for the joy and strengthening of God's people. Visual art comes from

a perspective, and gives the viewer an outlook on what is presented in a way that provokes thought and reflection. Look at Jake's drawing, and ponder what is intended, what is communicated, by this work of art. It is a visual gospel message. Most of us do not have the gift of drawing, but we have other skills that can be put to use for the good of Christ's church. Recently Marianne McDaniel shared her skill in sewing and embroidery to make another beautiful banner to celebrate our Youth Confirmation Class. Buzz and Sue Kandler shared their gift of time to display all the past years' confirmation banners around the sanctuary. During Holy Week, the Hecks, Freys, Coreys, Wehmeyers, Ahners, Claytons, and others shared their gifts of time and talent to decorate the church for Good Friday and Easter to bring out the somber or celebratory nature of the days. Throughout the year, the musicians of Zion give of their time and talent to bring joy and uplifting music to our worship experience. In just the last few weeks, Lisa Wehmeyer, Emily Stein, and Gloria Peterson have sung vocal solos to bring the text of the gospel to fuller life through music. Our brass ensemble led boisterous singing for Easter. This is but a short and very, very incomplete list of saints from Zion who have shared their time and talent for the blessing of God's people in the last couple months. (I am sure I have forgotten a number of people who have also served in wonderful ways, please understand no offense is intended, and all service shared for God's glory is much appreciated!)

Recently, during Preschool Staff Devotions, we had a reading based on Colossians 3:23, "Whatever you do, do it enthusiastically, as something done for the Lord and not for men." The devotion included the following thoughts: "Mediocrity and laziness have no place in the Christian's life. Christians must maintain integrity at home and in the workplace. Working for God, as opposed to working for other people, changes our perspective as we view our endeavors in light of what He has done for us. Our toil then becomes an offering to God. We not only worship God at church on Sunday, but our labor throughout the week is an offering of worship and thanksgiving to the One who has given us everything we have."

This also reminds me of a well-loved hymn, "Hark, the Voice of Jesus Crying," Hymn 826 in the Lutheran Service Book:

- 1. Hark, the voice of Jesus crying, "Who will go and work today? Fields are white and harvests waiting—Who will bear the sheaves away?" Loud and long the Master calleth; rich reward He offers thee. Who will answer, gladly saving, "Here am I, send me, send me"?
- 2. If you cannot speak like angels, if you cannot preach like Paul, You can tell the love of Jesus, you can say He died for all. If you cannot rouse the wicked with the judgment's dread alarms, You can lead the little children to the Savior's waiting arms.
- 3. If you cannot be a watchman, standing high on Zion's wall, Pointing out the path to heaven, off'ring life and peace to all, With your prayers and with your bounties you can do what God commands; You can be like faithful Aaron, holding up the prophet's hands.
- 4. Let none hear you idly saying, "There is nothing I can do," While the multitudes are dying and the Master calls for you. Take the task He gives you gladly, let His work your pleasure be; Answer quickly when He calleth, "Here am I, send me, send me!" (Public domain)

We ALL have talents and skills we can share in Christ's church. Like Jake Lara did on Good Friday, as he shared his artistic talent for the strengthening of God's people, may our outlook toward service in the church also be "Here am I, send me, send me."

Stewardship is not just about giving money to the church. It includes this, to be sure, but it is not limited to it. Stewardship involves our whole life – everything we have and everything we are.

Let us not, though, fall into the trap of thinking that because we give of ourselves in one area we can neglect giving in another. Stewardship is not stealing from Peter to pay Paul. It is not a game we play whereby we justify ourselves in not giving a tenth of our income because we have given in some other way. This is why our Lord warns:

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others." (Matthew 23:23)

We are given to do both – tithe of ourselves and what we have. And so it is that St. Paul makes his appeal to us:

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2)

We are to present our bodies as a living sacrifice to God. We are not to have the mind of the world, where we exchange equal weight of this for an equal weight of that, and then think that we have done what God has required.

Our whole life is given over for service in and for the Church of God. This is to be done in thanksgiving for what God in Christ has accomplished for us. This is our spiritual worship, the reasonable response to what He has done for us – not one for the other, but all in all.

But what does this look like? St. Paul never lays down a general principle without also giving us some practical application of what shape that principle is to take concretely. He gives the general principle that our bodies are to be living sacrifices to God, and, after admonishing those who have been given particular gifts of grace to serve the church, St. Paul then speaks generally of what is expected of all. He says:

"Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality." (Romans 12:9-13)

This is what it looks like to present your bodies as living sacrifices. This is how we live out the grace of God here in time.

Let us then heed the apostle's teaching. Let us present our bodies – everything that we have and everything that we are – as living sacrifices to God, our reasonable response to what God in Christ Jesus accomplished for us by His death and resurrection.

Through this we have forgiveness of sins, a new life in Christ, and eternal salvation. And through this worship, the grace of God is made manifest in His saints – for the church and the world.






