



From the Pastor

For the Pastor's Page this month, I would like to share some thoughts from the wife of a pastor who recently retired from our district. She does a wonderful job of describing the family that a congregation should be, and the pain that comes from losing a member of the family...in this case through members slipping into inactivity or delinquency.

"As a Pastor's wife God calls your husband to parts and people unknown. You move across the country totally away from family and friends. You are so ready to make new family and friends and I did this many times in several different congregations. You invest yourself in other people's lives, you share in their joys and sadness. You attend all of the events in their lives. Birthdays, anniversaries, wedding showers, baby showers, weddings, graduations, sports events - you are totally invested in them. You stand beside them in good times and bad times. UNCONDITIONALLY. Then one day they disappear from your life. They guit coming to church. They never call or explain why. You run through all of the scenarios in your mind - was it something I did or something my husband did - where are they? You see them in public and say how you miss them and they just smile. I don't think they have any clue about the grief I am experiencing. It is an unexplained death of a loved one. I have cried many times over this and have prayed for them and their well-being. There is no moral to this story - just a girl sharing her heartfelt feelings. Love from my heart." (Written by Karen Lecke, wife of retired pastor Joe Lecke)

Each week in our prayers in church, we include all those who are celebrating baptismal anniversaries that week. Often the people whose names are in the prayers are people whose bodies have not been in church for a very long time. Each month in the Echo, birthdays and baptismal anniversaries are listed for every member of the congregation that we have information on. Many of the names on these lists are currently members on paper only. When you hear a prayer for someone you have not seen in church for some time, or when you see a name in the Echo and you have not seen their face for a while, please do two things. First, pray for these individuals, that the Holy Spirit would be active in their lives to create in them a fervent desire to be in God's house receiving His Word and Sacrament on a regular basis. Then, after praying for them, get in contact with them and invite them!


Being together in God's house for worship is extremely important. The writer to the Hebrews says, "Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:19-25) Let us NOT FORSAKE ASSEMBLING TOGETHER. This means being together in worship on a weekly basis. ENCOURAGE ONE ANOTHER. That means reaching out to those whom we do not see on a weekly basis, and inviting them to return to the time of joy, support, and growth that is Christian worship.

In worship, God gives tremendous gifts that we cannot receive anywhere else. He comes to us in His Word and Sacrament. He teaches us and strengthens our faith as we hear His Word as it is read, as it is preached, and as it is sung together in worship. He forgives us as His Absolution is pronounced on us at the beginning of the Divine Service. He comes to us in the closest way possible in Holy Communion as He enters into us with His body and blood along with the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper. In this blessed meal, He feeds us with faith to sustain us for our daily life. These incredible gifts from God are surrounded by the saints singing praise to Him, which also serves to build up those around us as we join our voices together in thanksgiving.

Being together in worship is a joy. Being separated from each other in the Christian family is a sorrow. And, being separated from God in worship will likely eventually lead to being separated from God for all eternity. That is a tragedy. This sorrow and tragedy is felt profoundly by those who work in the church and by their families, as the paragraph written by the wife of a retired pastor shows. You can help. If a person comes to mind, and you have not seen them at Zion for quite some time, please pray for them, and then invite them. You can be a bearer of joy for Christ's Church.



St. Paul wrote to the Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). *God loves a cheerful giver*. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, Abel gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, Abraham prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.

What more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything, yes, even His life, enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us – like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ – give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart – for the joy set before us – the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.



Meeting called to order at 6:59 p.m.

Edward Jones: \$102,177.82General Fund: \$9,201.76

The final payment of \$1686.79 on the church mortgage will be made next week. \$38,716 remains on organ loan, which will be paid off by the end of June 2020.

Discussed other needs of congregation that money can go to after mortgage and organ loan are paid off such as building maintenance (HVAC system), member needs fund, etc.

◆Budget YTD: \$227,409.00◆Actual YTD: \$223,647.75

Elder's Report:

- •Discussed the "Transfer the Blessings" program \$5,000 cost for one year, quarterly payments of \$1250. Council would like to move forward with this but will hold off until after first of the year. Because the December Voters' meeting agenda already includes election of officers and next year's budget approval, will plan on discussing at April Voters' meeting. <u>MMSP</u>
- •Member Needs Fund − Elders looking at having a potluck after church one Sunday in November to raise money for Member Needs Fund.
- •Tony Lara is Elder of the month and Matt Sink is the bell ringer.
