May this season be filled with the hope that we long to experience at this time of the year. May your gatherings be filled with the joy that we celebrate in this festive season. Best wishes to you, and Seasons Greetings!

Was that paragraph a bit difficult to read? It was a bit difficult to write. What did you notice about the paragraph, or more importantly, what did you notice about what was not in the paragraph? What was missing was, of course, Christ. I made no mention of Christ, and in fact, no mention of Christmas. What I wrote is basically what our secular, increasingly pagan culture is reduced to saying lately.

There is lots of talk of joy, hope, love, peace, and celebration, but no reason for any of that. Think about this. I wished you joy, but only because for some vague and un-named reason, December should be filled with joy. Have joy because you should be joyful. The same is true for love and peace. May you experience peace because we some-

how mysteriously associate peace on earth with the month of December, so have peace. Likewise for hope. We long to experience hope, so we might as well hope for hope in December. Be hopeful because we want to have hope.

Well, that paragraph was probably even more difficult to read than the first paragraph. There is a reason for that. It is nonsense. Joy does not magically appear because we think we should have a month of joy. Peace does not wash over us because of wishful thinking. Hope does not just happen because we hope it will. All of these wishes are exactly that—wishes—and nothing more without a solid grounding and reason. They are baseless words, ideas without reality...if they are separated from Christmas and the Christ who is the reason for Christmas.

Now, let's put Christ back in Christmas and see what meaning we find. Why should we have joy this season? Why can we have joy this season? The familiar hymn says it so well, "Joy to the world, the Lord is come!" We have joy because God Himself has come among us. Joy at Christmas ultimately has a reason. Jesus has come to be our Savior, to rescue us from this fallen, sinful world of death. That is truly a reason to rejoice. We can share love with our family and friends during December and throughout the year because God has shown His love for us in sending Jesus as the baby at Bethlehem. We love because God first loved us. The peace we pray for at this Christmas season is rooted in the message the Angels joyfully delivered to the shepherds over Bethlehem, "Peace on earth, good will to those with whom He is pleased!" In sending His Son, God has made peace with us, not holding our sins which would separate us from Him against us, but drawing us to His embrace in a sacrificial act of peace for all time. Peace on earth is rooted in God making peace through the birth, death, and resurrection of His Son. And what is our hope in this holiday season? Hope detached from Christ is ultimately hopelessness. But in the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus we have hope. This hope is not just for a temporary improvement in our situation, but for ultimate deliverance from the evils of this world. Our hope is not for a brief time, but for all of eternity.

Without Christ, the greetings so commonly heard in December are shallow, hollow, and ultimately meaningless. But with Christ, these greetings are more than mere wishes, they are fulfilled truth in God's grace. Jesus brings joy. Jesus brings peace. Jesus brings love. Jesus brings hope. Those gifts flow from Him to us, and from us out to those around us. When we remember that the reason we celebrate is because of God's love in Jesus Christ, it all makes sense.

So let's try a December greeting again. As December comes upon us again with the annual celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ, born as God's gift of love to us, I wish you and your loved ones a very merry Christmas! May you be blessed to know the love that flows from the Father that would cause Him to send His Son for you. May you experience the peace promised by the angels as they announced the birth of the One who would make peace between God and fallen humanity. Rejoice, for Christ, the Savior is born! As the hope of the nations has been revealed in the birth of Jesus, who would undo the curse of sin and open the doors of heaven for us, may you also find tremendous hope for all eternity. May your gatherings be filled with the joy that comes from the reason for the season, the birth of Jesus Christ as our Savior. Blessings to you, and MERRY CHRISTMAS!


Our last day of school will be Friday, December 20. School will resume on Monday, January 6.

Elders Corner



This Echo article section from the Elders will be giving an update on some new opportunities that we will be helping organize for the church in the means of having remote Bible studies, devotions, or just small group meetings to encourage one another through ones computer or smart phone.

This will not be replacing Bible studies or other activities that are currently held at the church, but as a means to supplement those with a means for church members to connect, build relationships, and stay plugged into God's Word throughout everyone's busy lives away from our gathering at church.

There are several technologies and apps out there that support these endeavors. We are currently looking at utilizing an app called Zoom. Zoom is a free app that can provide audio and video meeting for up to 50 people on one meeting. Zoom is accessible and works on iOS, Android, Windows, and Mac platforms. It is fairly simple and many people including myself currently use it at their work for video conferences with multiple offices. There is a limit to 40 minutes of meeting time with this free app. Whichever church member is the host for the meeting, would send out a meeting invite thru the Zoom app (this could be done via email and or text). The meetings could be audio only for group discussions or video based discussions. The host could share their screen, if they had a Bible passage, Bible lesson, or even Bible study video playing on their phone or computer that they wanted the rest of the group to be able to see.


Anyone that might be interested would simply need to have a smart phone or computer and need an email address. The host of any meetings would need email addresses and smart phone numbers of all of those who wanted to partake in the group meetings.

The Elders see these as endless opportunities for connection of church members outside of church. This could possibly be an opportunity for a 5 to 15 minute quick Bible study or prayer/accountability groups once a week at the end of the day after kids are in bed, ½ hour bible study in the morning before the day gets started, or video studies of endless topics rooted in God's Word with the group getting together on Zoom to discuss.

If you would like to learn more about this opportunity, please see myself to discuss. We could demonstrate how to use Zoom.

If you are interested in forming a group (singles, retired, young parents, youth, men's, women's, etc. or even utilize by some existing church groups as means for meeting) please see your Elder to help get this organized and announced to the church.

Stewardship

Jesus, in His Sermon on the Mount, is teaching those who follow Him that worrying about the necessities of life is idolatry: worshipping a false god. This is because worry and anxiety show what we care about. Our anxiety reveals what we love and to what we're devoted. It reveals what we trust in.

This is why our Lord begins this section with an overarching principle: "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

But you say: "I must eat and drink. I must have clothing to wear and have a home in which to dwell." Yes, all these things you need. And Jesus says that your Father in heaven will ensure that you have them. He demonstrates this with a simple argument.

Your Father in heaven feeds the birds of the air, who neither sow, nor reap, nor gather into barns. He clothes the lilies of the field, who neither toil nor spin but are arrayed more luxuriously than Solomon in all his glory. If, then, your Father in heaven feeds the birds and clothes the lilies, how will He not also feed and clothe you when you are worth more than they are?

For you know that you are worth more than them. You are worth infinitely more. You are worth the price of the eternal Son of God. Did the Son of God come down from heaven and become a lily? Did he descend and take on the form of a bird? No!

He came down from heaven and became a man: flesh of our flesh and bone of our bone. He is one of us, our brother. And what did He do when He became flesh to dwell among us? He gave His holy, precious blood and His innocent suffering and death, that you might be His own and live under Him in His kingdom forever.

God became man in Christ Jesus. He lived the life we failed to live, and He died the death we deserve because of it. He was raised again on the third day to overcome sin and death ... for us. He was crucified for our transgressions and raised for our justification. So, if your Father in heaven has given His Son to die for us in order that we might live with Him eternally, how will He not also give us all things to support this body and life?

To be anxious about the necessities of life, to devote yourself to food and clothing, to care about this and find security in it, is to serve another god. It is to deny that you will live forever because Jesus, the Son of God is risen from the dead, lives and reigns for all eternity. It is to believe that God – who created you, redeemed you by the death and resurrection of His Son, and sanctifies you by His Spirit – will not keep His promises of sustaining you in this life.

Jesus says this: Seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness. God's kingdom is His rule among us. His rule among us comes when our Father in heaven gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity. This is what we ask God to do for us in the prayer Jesus taught us.

Your Father in heaven knows what you need – food and clothing, house and home, etc. – and He promises to give it to you. Chief of the things you need is His grace and mercy in His Son, Jesus Christ. So, seek after that. Those who seek will find. And all the necessities of life, our Lord says, will be added to you.
