


Glo-ry be to Thee, O Lord.

Distribution

During the Distribution, the camera will be focused on the cross at the front of Zion to allow for privacy for those who commune.

Zion Lutheran practices the policy of close communion, communing only those who share our common Biblical view of the Lord's Supper. If you are not a confirmed LCMS Lutheran, please confer with the pastor before communing.

The pastor and those who assist him receive the body and blood of Christ first and then distribute them to members who will remain seated in the pews. When you receive the communion tray, please wait to commune until all trays are distributed. Pastor Clayton will then return to the front and invite the entire congregation to commune together at the same time saying:

Take, eat; this is the true body of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, given into death for your sins.

Take, drink; this is the true blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, shed for the forgiveness of your sins.







ENTRANCE/EXIT OPTIONS

With the ongoing uncertainty caused by the coronavirus, various members have various levels of comfort in public places. In response to this, the Elders are recommending an entry/exit suggestion. If you feel more comfortable with your health, and would like the chance to talk with Pastor and other church family after the service, we recommend that you park in the parking lot adjacent to the church (the west side) and enter and exit through the main double doors. If you are less comfortable with health and safety in light of the coronavirus, or if you simply would like to exit church more quickly without talking, we recommend that you park in the parking lot across the street from the church, beside the parsonage (the east side) and enter and exit through the single door by the stairway leading to the balcony. Either way, out of respect for your fellow worshipers who may have different health concerns or comfort levels about the virus, please wear your mask from when you enter the building on either side until you get to your pew and from when you leave your pew until you exit the building. OPPORTUNITY TO ATTEND A CONFERENCE WITH PASTOR CLAYTON

Pastor Clayton is enrolled in a course called "DOXOLOGY" for ongoing training in pastoral care and leadership. The overall "DOXOLOGY" program has three parts. The first is attended by the pastor alone. (Pastor Clayton attended this session in June.) The second is attended by the pastor and lay leaders from the congregation. The third is attended by the pastor and his wife.

The second component of the program, called "ENCORE," for the pastor and lay leaders from the congregation, will be held in Nebraska on Nov. 20-22, 2020. (That's a Friday through Sunday.) ZION IS LOOKING FOR VOLUNTEERS TO ATTEND THIS WORKSHOP WITH PASTOR CLAYTON. Ideal candidates will be established members of the congregation who plan to remain in the congregation for years to come, so the insight gained can have a long-lasting positive impact on Zion, Mascoutah.

The ENCORE program will include the following events and topics:

- •Pastor and laity are immersed into a community where worship punctuates the day and night; The Word is preached, prayers are prayed, and hymns are sung. The rhythm of worship provides laity with a renewed appreciation for the riches of the church's sacred music and liturgical heritage.
- Pastors and lay leaders will review new servanthood models and people skills to equip them to respond with confidence to very real parish challenges.
- •Structured conversation and unstructured time together to enhance relationships between pastor and parishioners.
- •Lay leaders will grow in their appreciation for God's gifts in His Gospel and Sacrament and their pastor's ministry for the cure of souls.
- •Work groups, comprising pastors and laity from different congregations will be created to think Biblically and imaginatively about the church's evangelistic outreach locally and globally. This gives lay leaders the chance to dialog with lay leaders from other congregations about how best to strengthen the ministry in the parish.

The total cost for a lay person to attend this weekend is \$275, and depending on how many lay leaders from the congregation are interested in attending, some financial assistance may be available through the congregation.
