From the Pastor

Over the last several months, I have seen numerous jokes about how people want to get out of the year 2020. One from early in the Covid lockdowns went something like this: "I have finished my 3 month free trial of 2020, I'd like to cancel my subscription." One I have seen more recently refers to the time change coming up. (Remember to set your clocks back an hour on Saturday night, Oct. 31.) Despite the fact that we are setting our clocks back, the joke says, "Remember to set your clocks ahead this fall. I think about four months would be good." It is probably true that the year 2020 will not be one that many of us look back upon with joy and fondness.

However, does that mean that we should not give thanks? Perhaps we should cancel our annual Thanksgiving Day service, or replace it with a "Grippers and Complainers Day Service." No. In any and every situation, we give thanks. St. Paul writes in Philippians 4:11-13, "I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. I know

how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. I can do all things through Him who strengthens me.” By the way, St. Paul was in prison when he wrote this. Not in moderate quarantine due to Covid, but in prison due to Christianity. Even in prison, Paul gave thanks. In our locked-down year of 2020, we can give thanks too.

This Thanksgiving Day, I would strongly encourage that we give thanks for one another. Give thanks for the people around you. Thank God for the people in your family. Thank God for the people at work. Thank God for your friends. Thank God for those who are not your friends, but who push you harder than you would like to do your best. Thank God for every one of the vast, diverse array of people who make up our community, our nation, and our world. And, of course, thank God for your church family.

I think it is especially important in these dark Covid days to give thanks for people. God surrounds us with family, friends, and coworkers as a gift. And yet, in the light of Covid, we have come to view people with fear and suspicion. I still see it happening, when people walk toward each other on the sidewalk, one steps out in the street, fearful of human contact. When someone comes into a room, others separate to corners, terrified by the presence of a human being. Nursing home and hospital staffs are forbidding loved ones from seeing each other out of fear. We are terrified that someone around us might have Covid and not be aware of it yet. We have been taught to be scared of each other.

This is why we should give thanks for the people God has placed in our life this year. The people around us should not be sources of terror to us, they should be causes of rejoicing and thanksgiving. God did not make us to be solitary creatures. Rare is the person who can truly thrive in absolutely isolation. God made us to be gathered into families, friends, communities, and societies. God’s plan is good, it is stronger than a virus, and it is longer-lasting than a quarantine. God gives us to each other as gifts, not as threats. This year especially, we need to give thanks for the people God places around us, and receive His gift of humanity with thanksgiving, not with fear.

We do need to celebrate Thanksgiving in 2020, even though many seem to wish that the year were over or never begun. When we do give thanks this year (on Thursday, November 26 and every other day!), may we be guided by the words of St. Paul from Philippians 1:3-6, “I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And I am sure of this, that He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.”

I give thanks...*for you!* We give thanks...*for each other.* Thanks be to God.

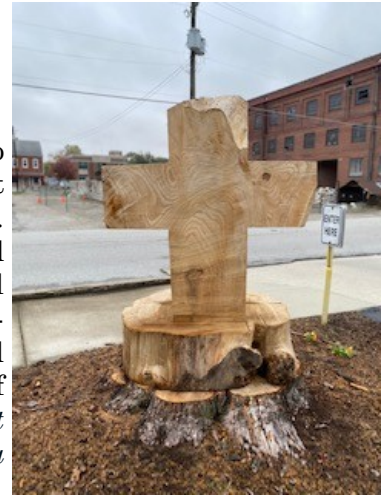

Zion's New Cross

When the old maple tree by the entrance to the west parking lot was taken down last Spring, the stump was carved into a cross. Unfortunately, there wasn't enough good wood in the stump and the cross soon fell apart. A new tree trunk was recently acquired, and a new cross was carved and placed on the old stump. It reminds one of the scripture in Isaiah 11: *"Then a shoot will spring from the stem of Jesse, And a branch from his roots will bear fruit."*



The new cross also happens to have a natural gash in the side, which may correspond to the gash left in the side of Jesus from the Roman spear.

There was enough room in the trunk to carve space for one to sit at the foot of the cross, corresponding to the scripture in Matthew 11: *"Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest."*

In the back on the stump is another natural cleft, in which has been hidden a geocache. The geocache contains this information about the cross, as well as a brief history of Zion Church. But this natural cleft also may correspond to the old favorite hymn, *"Rock of Ages, cleft for me. Let me hide myself in Thee."*

This new cross is carved from Catalpa wood, which is long-lasting in outdoor conditions. It will be treated with a preservative from time to time to help it to last as long as possible. May you all be blessed as you enter the parking lot or drive by this cross, knowing all the wonderful things about our Lord which this cross may inspire in your hearts and minds.

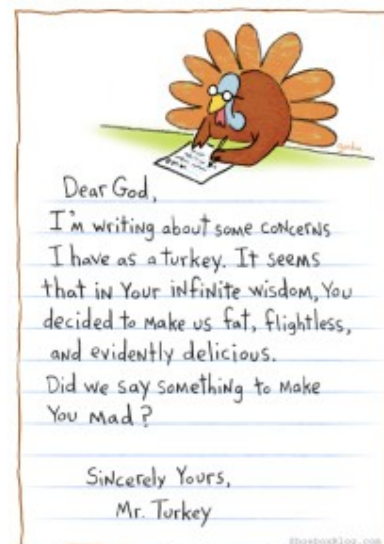

October 6, 2020 via Zoom**

Call to order

Opening Prayer and Devotion – Elder Mark Krausz

Roll Call – Torri Suedmeyer, Ken Knutson, Mark Krausz, Christa Sink, Dale Wehmeyer, Cheryl Sax, Terry Twenhafel, and Pastor Clayton (joined at 7:50pm).

Approval of September meeting minutes.

MMSP to approve September meeting minutes with change made to spelling of “Kraus” to “Krausz.”

Treasurer’s Report:

- Terry needs budget requests from committees and boards in order to prepare FY2021 budget.
- Terry will be turning in application for forgiveness of PPP loan.
- Terry has requested \$15,000 be transferred from Preschool to cover payroll.
- Current balances:
 - First Federal Savings Bank - \$47,814.82
 - Busey Bank (PPP) - \$39,200.00
 - Petty Cash Asset - \$50.00
 - Edward Jones - \$88,972.25

MMSP – to accept the Treasurer’s Report.

Board of Finance Report:

- 2020 Budget YTD: \$227,685.00
- 2020 Actual YTD: \$196,697.98
- Over/Under YTD: (\$30,987.02)
- Quarterly giving statements mailed to congregation. Giving is down from last year and the hope is that December will see an uptick in giving to help cover the lack of offerings due to COVID.

Board of Elders Report:

- Seminararian Makey doing a wonderful job with adult Bible class on Book of James via Zoom and some in-person in sanctuary.
- October is Pastor Appreciation Month.
- Discussion regarding pastor/elder performance. Also discussed suggestions and ideas to prepare for more “normal” services. For month of November, Communion will be served weekend of November 7th-8th and November 28th-29th.
- Mark thanked the Altar Guild for their efforts and hard work during these tough times.
- A member thanked Elders (especially Tony Lara) for doing such a good job at this time.

Pastor’s Report:

 - Circuit/District/Synod Events: 13

 - Doxology--next component will be held in Nebraska Nov. 20-22. REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN. It is time to move from information from me and contemplation for you, to DECISION, ACTION, and SIGNING UP. I would like at least one Council member from this year or next year (in addition to Elders) to come along.
 - Bible Class/Sunday School/Confirmation Class/Youth Bible Class are all back in action in some form. Most are over Zoom. Amanda Kemezys and Lindsay Murphy are doing some really nice, innovative work in Youth Bible Class.
 - Am in conversation with Elders as to how/when to return to a more “normal” congregational schedule and worship life.
 - Am attending a Doxology Covid-care Retreat called “Take Heart! Strength and Confidence for Demanding Days” in Indiana. I would like to share a thought from one of yesterday’s sessions with you.
 - Thanks Council for all you have been doing and all the creative solutions you have found. You have all done a phenomenal job of working through Covid challenges. (This is not what you signed on for, but God has assembled the right team for Zion at this trying time.)

- According to research, greater challenges may well be coming. Please be in prayer for one another as we will likely face greatly increased stress coming out of a “honeymoon” peaceful period in the congregation within the next several months.
- Prayer and care requests for ongoing patience and peace for Zion as we continue to work through the challenges of the year and for farmers as they enter their busiest and most stressful time of the year.

Board of Education Report:

•**Preschool:**

- Doing very well with in-person and remote learning.
- Butter Braid fundraiser outpaced last year.
- New computer purchased for director’s office.

•**Sunday School:**

- Jenna Dunn is working on a parent/teacher survey for possible in-person spring classes.
- Looking for Assistant Superintendent candidate.
- Council suggests Sunday School move checking account from Regions to First Federal to avoid paying extra fees.

•**Youth Group:**

- Executive meeting on October 15 to discuss events.

Board of Trustees Report:

- Handicapped door system – working on bids and ideas on implementation.
- Audio/Visual System – Discussed options presented to purchase new equipment for Facebook Live streaming services. MMSP to purchase “high end equipment” as presented by trustees via email quotes for Facebook Live services.
- HVAC –
 - No new bids at this time.
 - Will contact companies for bids and possible service calls.

- Property for sale presented to Zion for purchase – discussed property to east of Zion’s parsonage parking lot for possible purchase from owner. Council wants a walk-through of house before offer made to establish usage ability and needs. Zion has \$176,000 total cash on hand but will need to keep most of that in reserve. Discussed purchase for cash via loan. More discussion and information needed before final decision to present to voters on how to purchase property. MMSP that Council recommends to voters that we approve the purchase of properties offered at \$75,000 with first priority rights to purchase additional two lots.
- Discussed possible special voters meeting to propose purchase of property for sale.
- Candidate for elections
 - All boards have started to ask members to volunteer as candidates for open positions to be voted on at December voter’s meeting.
 - Positions available include: Vice President, Treasurer, 2 Elders, 2 Trustees, BOE, BOF, Sunday School Assist. Superintendent.
 - Discussion about possible Zion By-law changes for Board of Education.

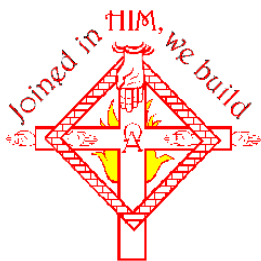
