ZION RE-OPENING PLAN

Zion is excited to announce that we will implement changes for the Sunday morning services. We will no longer be asking for reservations for Sunday morning services, and you are welcome to attend as you are comfortable. Zion asks that members adhere to mask and social distance guidelines while inside the church building. Please allow an empty pew between family units. If you are fully vaccinated, you may choose not to wear a mask or not social distance according to your level of comfort. If you are not fully vaccinated, we ask that you adhere to the guideline of wearing a mask if you are not able to maintain a social distance of six feet. If you would like more space to social distance, the far-right seating section will be available with two empty pews between occupied pews. If you would like more space, please ask to be seated in the far-right seating section. Thank you for your consideration of these guidelines. For Sunday morning services, Communion will be by continuous line, by seating section. Saturday night services will remain unchanged, with reservations requested, seating assignments, two empty pews, and communion using the wooden trays. Drive-through Communion will be discontinued in June. If you are unable to attend a service and would like to receive Communion, please contact Pastor Clayton and he will make an appointment to bring you Communion in your home.

Featuring national and international carillonneurs, the concerts are held at 7 p.m. Tuesdays in June and are part of the Concordia Seminary Concert Series. Bring your lawn chairs, blankets, and picnics, and enjoy the music from the Main Quadrangle or on the Seminary grounds near Luther Statue. In the event of rain, guests may gather under the archways and tower on campus. The carillon at Concordia Seminary is one of only 170 such instruments in North America.
