### **PASTOR CLAYTON'S GERMANY LUTHER SITES AND OBERAMMERGAU TOUR HAS SPACE**

The world is opening back up after Covid, and plans are underway to host the Oberammergau Passion Play in 2022, after it was postponed from 2020. Pastor Clayton was scheduled to lead a tour to see Luther and Bach sites and attend the Oberammergau Passion Play, along with experiencing various cultural sites events, but the tour was postponed. Due to changes in plans, some of the attendees who had reserved spots on the 2020 tour can no longer participate, so a limited number of spots are now available for the 2022 version of the tour with Pastor Clayton.
