

# From the Pastor

I try to begin my days with a devotion from a book called, *A Year with the Church Fathers*. This devotional booklet follows the same daily Scripture readings that I send out to the congregation by email each day and features several paragraphs from writings of the early church fathers from the first few centuries after Jesus' earthly ministry. Each writing from one of the church fathers is introduced by a few paragraphs written a few years ago specifically for this devotional resource. I find these devotions to be thought-provoking, often profound. Here is a sample, in honor of Easter, that I came across in my readings recently.

This particular devotion was based on Mark 12:18-27. "And Sadducees came to him, who say that there is no resurrection. And they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies and leaves a wife, but leaves no child, the man must take the widow and raise up offspring for his brother. There were seven brothers; the first took a wife, and when he died

left no offspring. And the second took her, and died, leaving no offspring. And the third likewise. And the seven left no offspring. Last of all the woman also died. In the resurrection, when they rise again, whose wife will she be? For the seven had her as wife.' Jesus said to them, 'Is this not the reason you are wrong, because you know neither the Scriptures nor the power of God? For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. And as for the dead being raised, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the passage about the bush, how God spoke to him, saying, "I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob"? He is not God of the dead, but of the living. You are quite wrong." (English Standard Version)

#### The devotion notes,

How many carping evasions we fling at God's promise to raise the dead! "Who has seen the dead raised?" we mock like the Sadducees. "What will resurrected life be—all harps and clouds, with that incessant singing of angels?" Our resurrection is assured in who God is. He does not desire to be the champion of the dead. He will raise the faithful to life with Him because He passionately desires eternal fellowship with us. He is and remains the God of those whom we call dead. What He says changes what is. Our eyes, senses, and feelings are all called liars by the divine Word (John 11:25-26)...

Death separates us from our loved ones. This is the cause of the tears and sorrow attendant upon the loss of death. Those who die in Christ are not separated from the God who redeemed them. This is why the Church solemnly cries, "It is not death to die!" Death cannot hold those who belong to the one who will not let death stand. He was fed into death's maw only to spring death's jaws forever so that it can no longer hold those who are in Him. Death was inoculated with the medicine of immortality deadly to it. Its power was taken from it. The dead will escape from its jaws. Christ afflicted death by snatching its possessions: us.

The Holy One called Moses from the bush and said, "I am...the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob" (Exodus 3:6). When death heard this utterance, he trembled in fear, was disturbed by terror, and knew that he had not become king forever over the children of Adam. From the time he heard God saying to Moses, "I am...the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob," death struck his hands together for he learned that God is king of the dead and of the living, and that it is appointed to the children of Adam to come forth from his darkness and arise with their bodies. See also that our Redeemer, Jesus, when He repeated this utterance to the Sadducees, who were disputing with Him about the resurrection of the dead, said, "He is not the God of the dead, but of the living" (Mark 12:27).

The devotion includes the following prayer: "Lord God heavenly Father, the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, Your servant Moses proclaimed the resurrection to the children of Israel to give them hope in the midst of their darkness. As we journey to the darkness of the cross, give us hope to look beyond it to the light of the resurrection; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, Amen."

As we look to the cross and the empty tomb in the coming weeks, let us remember that our earthly senses lie to us. Death is not death. What a statement, "The Church solemnly cries, 'It is not death to die!" We can make this exclamation because Christ, by His death, has defeated and destroyed death. In this confidence, have a blessed celebration of Easter! He is risen! And so will we.

#### Blessed Shall You Be

"Blessed shall you be in the city and blessed shall you be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your ground and the fruit of your cattle, the increase of your herds and the young of your flock. Blessed shall be your basket and your kneading bowl. Blessed shall you be when you go out." (Deuteronomy 28:3-6)

This is God's promise to the Israelites as they stood beyond the Jordan outside of the Promised Land. He promises blessing to His people. He will make them prosper, whether they are in the city or the field. He will make their fruit of their work to prosper, whether from the ground, their wombs, their flocks, or their herds. He will make them to prosper in all things, whether upon their coming in or they're going out.

But there's a catch. He would do this for Israel only "if you obey the voice of the LORD your God." (Deut. 28:2b) If they did that, He would cause that "all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you." (Deut. 28:2a). If they didn't obey the voice of the Lord, if they didn't keep the commandments of the Lord and "walk in his ways" (Deut. 28:9), they would be met with curse and woe. The blessings would be replaced with curses. Everything that the Lord promised to prosper and bless would be cursed and fail.

Thanks be to God that our Lord Jesus Christ has come into our flesh and fulfilled the law for us — in our place and for our benefit. Our Lord Jesus Christ died for us — in our place and for our benefit. Our Lord Jesus Christ is risen from the dead for us — in our place and for our benefit. By this we have justification before God. We are forgiven, clean, holy, and righteous. The blessing of God is promised to us in Christ Jesus. It depends upon his work, not ours.

All this is ours in Holy Baptism. For in Holy Baptism, God claims us as His own, makes us His children, His heirs, and His holy people. And so it is that the work of our hands and its fruit is holy because we are holy in Christ. It is pressed into His service, and it thereby becomes a blessing to us and to our neighbor.

For this great gift, our reception of the blessings of God because of Christ Jesus our Lord, it is our duty to thank and praise, serve, and obey Him. This is not in order to receive the blessings but because in Christ we already have. With this in mind, we sit down on the first day of the week and set aside as He has prospered us to give to His church for His work of blessing in our midst (1 Cor. 16:2).




