




Offering





We know that all have suffered much separation and loss due to these lockdowns, and we need time to grieve for what we have missed. However, we also recognize that the Lord is

with us, and we trust that He will continue to provide for us and cause His will to be done among us, which gives us hope. We would like to invite any and all members of the congregation to write down and share memories about the last two years of the lockdowns, both in terms of what we mourn, and where we find hope in the Lord. While we will not be able to share all of these memories and thoughts during the service, we hope to publish and provide a booklet of these collected thoughts from our members so we can share in each other's sorrows, carry each other's burdens, and live together in hope.
