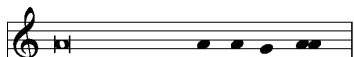

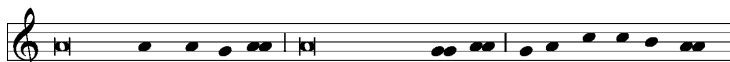

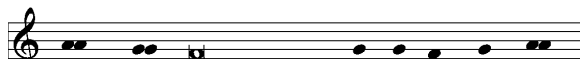

in Him will the Gentiles hope."






