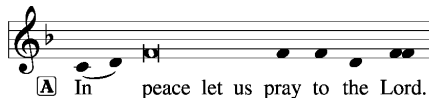

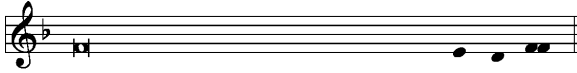

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR EARTHQUAKE RELIEF IN SYRIA

You have likely heard of the earthquake that devastated Turkey and Syria. It is estimated that 35,000 were killed,

and 90,000 injured. Arabic Lutheran Ministries is partnering with several Christian organizations that work with refugees and the displaced in Syria and Lebanon. Teams are ready in Aleppo and other cities that were affected by the recent earthquake to take action. Despite the dangerous circumstances, Arabic Lutheran Ministries has been able to open a center for the displaced families through a church in Aleppo, where more than 300 families are staying. The immediate need for these families is food, clothing, and various personal supplies. More teams of volunteers are being sent to reach other devastated Syrian cities such as Latakia, Tartus and Jableh, to start centers to shelter families and help with their basic needs. If you would like to donate to this relief effort, place your contributions in the jars at the back of the sanctuary.
