I pledge allegiance to the flag Of the United States of America, And to the Republic, for which it stands, One nation, under God, indivisible, With liberty and justice for all.



First Reading

1 Samuel 7:3-12

And Samuel said to all the house of Israel, "If you are returning to the Lord with all your heart, then put away the foreign gods and the Ashtaroth from among you and direct your heart to the Lord and serve Him only, and He will deliver you out of the hand of the Philistines." So the people of Israel put away the Baals and the Ashtaroth, and they served the Lord only. Then Samuel said, "Gather all Israel at Mizpah, and I will pray to the Lord for you." So they gathered at Mizpah and drew water and poured it out before the Lord and fasted on that day and said there, "We have sinned against the Lord." And Samuel judged the people of Israel at Mizpah. Now when the Philistines heard that the people of Israel had gathered at Mizpah, the lords of the Philistines went up against Israel. And when the people of Israel heard of it, they were afraid of the Philistines. And the people of Israel said to Samuel, "Do not cease to cry out to the Lord our God for us, that He may save us from the hand of the Philistines." So Samuel took a nursing lamb and offered it as a whole burnt offering to the Lord. And Samuel cried out to the Lord for Israel. But the Lord thundered with a mighty sound that day against the Philistines and threw them into confusion, and they were defeated before Israel. And the men of Israel went out from Mizpah and pursued the Philistines and struck them, as far as below Beth-car. Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen and called its name Ebenezer; for he said, "Till now the Lord has helped us."

Second Reading

What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son but gave Him up for us all, how will He not also with Him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep

Romans 8:31-39

to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.


Third Reading

Matthew 8:5-10, 13

When He entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to Him, appealing to Him, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, suffering terribly." And He said to him, "I will come and heal him." But the centurion replied, "Lord, I am not worthy to have You come under my roof, but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I too am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. Alicia "Lee" Hinton served 20 years with the U.S. Air Force, retiring as a Master Sergeant in June of 2019. During her tenure with the U.S. Air Force, she served as a weather forecaster supporting many different aircraft and units throughout Air Mobility Command, Pacific Air Forces, Air Force Special Operations Command, and Central Command. She also served a one-year special duty assignment as an Inspector General for the 618 Air Operations Center. She culminated her career as the Manager of Weather Policy and Standardization, Headquarters Air Mobility Command, Scott Air Force Base, Illinois. Her assignments included Delaware, Guam, Mississippi, Illinois (twice), Alaska, and Japan. During her career, she deployed six times in support of Operations JOINT GUARDIAN, IRAQI FREEDOM, ENDURING FREEDOM, and INHERENT RESOLVE. Her deployments included Kosovo, Spain, Iraq, Afghanistan, Qatar, and Turkey.

After retiring from the military, Lee began working for The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) Ministry to the Armed Forces. In this position, she supports all LCMS chaplains and military personnel by providing religious materials, setting up training events, and overseeing multiple programs, such as Ministry-by-Mail, Adopt-A-Chap, and Operation Barnabas. She also helps LCMS pastors interested in becoming chaplains in the military, Civil Air Patrol, Coast Guard Auxiliary, or Department of Veterans Affairs navigate the ecclesiastical endorsement process.

Originally from Staten Island, New York, Lee is married to her high school sweetheart, Thomas. They have three amazing children, Kayla, Tyler, and Ryan. Lee enjoys spending time with her family, reading, learning new things, and traveling. Lee and her family reside in O'Fallon, Illinois and are active members of Zion Lutheran Church in Mascoutah, Illinois.
