

The Rev. Dr. Jon D. Vieker is Associate Professor of Practical Theology and Dean of Chapel at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. Before joining the seminary faculty, Vieker served as senior assistant to LCMS President Dr. Matthew C. Harrison from 2010 to 2021. From 1998 to 2010, he served as assistant director for the LCMS Commission on Worship during the research, development, editing, and production of *Lutheran Service Book* and its core companion volumes. From 1989 to 1998, Vieker served as parish pastor at St. Mark's Lutheran Church, West Bloomfield, Mich. Vieker received a BA in music from California Lutheran University, Thousand Oaks, Calif., and M.Div., STM, and PhD degrees from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Mo. He has edited and authored a variety of publications and is a composer with choral settings and organ preludes published by Concordia Publishing House and Liturgy Solutions.
