This reminds us of the victory that Jesus won for us by His death on the cross, and that we live as He has called us to "take up our cross and follow Him." Zion's new processional cross was used in that way for Pastor Stein's Ordination and will be used both Reformation Sunday and All Saints Sunday, as well as for upcoming Festival Services such as Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, and Trinity Sundays. "Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim, till all the world adore His saving name!"

The Southern Illinois District (SID) of the LCMS is in mission partnership with the "Concordia the Reformer" Seminary in the Dominican Republic. For the next few weeks, we will include a prayer for the Lord's work in the Dominican Republic in the Divine Service each week, and then have a bulletin announcement sharing a bit more information about that prayer. This week, we thank God for the translation work being done to make important theological works available in Spanish for use at the Concordia the Reformer Seminary. The latest translation news is that 7,000 copies of Lutheran hymnals in Spanish are now available in the Dominican Republic! Lutheran Heritage Fund (LHF) has printed 18,000 additional copies of this hymnal, which are on their way to other Lutheran churches throughout South and Central America. As with the first edition of this ground-breaking hymnal that is uniting Spanish-speaking Lutherans around the world, this project was accomplished by the blessing of the Holy Spirit and in partnership with the Spanish Hymnal Committee, LCMS Latin America, and LCMS Office of National Mission, as well as through the mission gifts of many generous LHF supporters. Another VDMA project that is benefitting the seminarians, deaconess, and church plants in the Dominican is the PDF formatted Daily Devotions in Spanish that are now available.


