

A quick explanation of the ashes of Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday gets its name from a longstanding Christian custom. On this day, many Christians wear a cross made of ashes on their foreheads.

The cross made of ashes represents two things:

First, ashes have long been used as a symbol of mourning. In Biblical times, people would express grief by sitting in ashes. The ashes express my sadness that I have sinned against God. I am sinful from birth, and this shows itself in my life in thoughts, words and actions that go against what God has commanded. The ashes that I wear symbolize how I acknowledge and confess my sins to God.

Second, however, notice that the ashes are in the shape of a cross. This reminds me that Jesus Christ gave up his life for me on a cross. By doing this, Jesus took the guilt of my sins upon himself. The shape of the cross reminds me that God has completely and freely forgiven my sins, based on the work of Jesus Christ.

If you, O LORD, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand?
But with you there is forgiveness. (Psalm 130:3,4)

BIBLE TIPS FOR GOOD COMMUNICATION IN RELATIONSHIPS

February, with Valentine's Day, is a great time of year to focus on our relationships! Good communication is the key to any relationship. Good communication ensures that both parties feel respected, validated, and understood. Communication is the key to avoiding and straightening out any misunderstandings, and to working through problems.

TREAT EACH OTHER AS YOU WOULD WISH TO BE TREATED

Matthew 7:12 tells us "Therefore, whatever you want others to do for you, do also the same for them..."

This is a powerful principle to apply to any relationship. Think about it – how do you respond to nagging, shouting, or being spoken to in an unkind way? When you treat each other well, you open the door for honest, loving biblical communication in relationships that nourishes both the parties.

KEEP PRAYER AT THE HEART OF YOUR RELATIONSHIP

1 Thessalonians 5:17 tells us to "Pray continually."

Faith is at the heart of Christian lives, and that places it at the heart of Christian marriages too. Prayer aligns us with God and reminds of His love, care, compassion, and faithfulness to us, and ours to Him. Prayer means taking problems before God too and letting Him know what is truly in our hearts. If you have concerns about communication in a relationship, give them to God in prayer and let Him know your worries. After all, he already knows your heart.

PRACTICE FORGIVENESS

Ephesians 4:32 tells us to "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

It's hard to communicate well when one or both of you are angry, resentful, or nurse hurtful sentiments from the past. Letting your negative emotions get the best of you is against biblical principles. You must let go of them to ensure peaceful communication as a Christian. Learn to practice forgiveness as shown by Christ, so you can approach one another with open, trusting hearts. Forgiveness is critical for healthy communication in a Christian.

TAKE TIME TO LISTEN

James 1:19-20 tells us that "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry."

This is wonderful relationship advice that, once implemented, will change the way you communicate with each other. Christian faith gives us a common ground, a kind and loving foundation from which you can build relationships that nourishes both parties and brings you closer to each other, and to God. As is stated in 2 Corinthians 13:14 "May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, I "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but help and support him in every physical need" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our hulmanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.
