

Every once in a while when you are browsing the internet, you come across something interesting or helpful. A while back, I came across this, and I thought it would be a good reminder as we start a new year.

A list (in order) of parental duties for Christian homes:

The first duty of parents: Have your children baptized.

The first duty of parents: Be together with your children in God's house.

The first duty of parents: Be believers and doers of the faith.

The first duty of parents: Be prepared to teach the faith to your children.

The first duty of parents: Be active in growing in your faith and teaching it to your children.

Everything on the parent list for raising Christian families is number one. There are no secondary Christian duties.

Secondary or tertiary things are:

- 1. Sports
- 2. Activities (Dance, 4H, hunting, fishing, camping, travel, etc.)
- 3. Always using work as the reason you aren't doing the first duties.
- 4. Anything that keeps you from the first things. Stop making these first!

Our world is wildly out of focus. There has always been a pull to focus on things other than God and His gifts. However, in recent years, this pull has intensified dramatically. Many can remember when there were no activities scheduled on Sunday mornings. Some can remember when even Wednesday evening was an open evening to allow for church activities. Now, there is virtually no concession for Wednesday church activities at all. As a result, family participation in Wednesday activities at church, such as Advent and Lent Midweek services, has fallen significantly. Even Sunday mornings are now busy with various activities. Our family knows this as well. Over the years, and with increasing frequency, we have kept our children out of activities on Sunday mornings so that they can be in church. Activities we have kept our children home from, or adjusted schedules to be home in time for church, include robotics, scouts, football, wrestling, and more.

I am not saying that to pat myself on the back, to show what a dedicated Christian parent I am. Quite the opposite. I am saying that to show that I know how hard it is to put Christian parenting first. I am personally aware of the sacrifices we make, and we ask our children to make, in order to have them in God's House to receive His gifts each week. Yet, despite the difficulties, it is exactly what we are called to do. God and His gifts come first.

As parents, grandparents, and mentors, we have no greater privilege and responsibility than growing in faith ourselves, and passing that faith along to the children entrusted to our care. The best way for us to grow in faith ourselves is to be in God's House at every opportunity, studying His Word in Bible Class, hearing His Word in the Divine Service, and receiving the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ in the closest contact we can have with Him this side of eternity in the Lord's Supper. Then, as we ourselves are in church every week, we not only are blessed and grow in faith ourselves, we also show by example how important this is for us.

The children around us learn much more from what they see in us than what they hear from us. Our children will prioritize what they see that we prioritize. If they see us making every effort to be in church at every opportunity, they will see how important this is for them as well. If they see us joyfully and eagerly looking forward to receiving God's gifts in Word and Sacrament, then they will be joyful and eager to receive these gifts from God as well.

On the other hand, if our children see us coming to church only when it is easy and convenient for us, but making every effort to get to other activities such as sports practices or music events, etc., then our children will likewise learn by experience that being in church is really not all that important. Even worse, if our children hear us complaining about what happens at church, or gossiping about people at church, or expressing anger at events taking place at church, then our children will want nothing to do with being in God's House. We might say that positive actions speak louder than positive words, but negative words can easily overcome even our most positive actions. Negative words cut deep.

So, if our first duty as parents, grandparents, and mentors is to have your children baptized, be together with your children in God's house, be believers and doers of the faith, be prepared to teach the faith to your children, and be active in growing in your faith and teaching it to your children, then the first thing to do is put that into practice ourselves. Our children are watching, and they will largely follow our example.

With that in mind, we will look forward to seeing you in Bible Class and in worship, hearing the Word and receiving the Sacrament at every possible opportunity. I look forward to seeing you!

The Chief Stewards of Humanity: Mom and Dad

St. Paul tells the Ephesians that the first commandment with a specific promise attached to it is, "Honor your father and mother so that it may go well with you, and you may live long in the land" (Eph. 6:2). This promise is one indication of the importance of this commandment. The other thing that highlights the special nature of this commandment is its placement within the Ten Commandments.

The Ten Commandments are clearly organized in two big categories. The first three commandments deal with our relationship with God. This category is called the First Table of the Law. The last seven commandments, the Second Table of the Law, tell us how we should relate to other people. These two tables correspond to what Jesus calls the two greatest commandments: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind," and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matt. 22:37–39).

The order of the Second Table of the Law is also important. Murder is a greater sin than adultery, which is a greater sin that stealing, or lying, or coveting. But why is the Fourth Commandment first in the Second Table, ahead of "you shall not murder"? Is disobeying your parents really worse than murder? Or maybe we should give up on thinking these commandments are ordered?

The overall effect of this order is to get us to see our parents as a connection point between our neighbors and our God. Throughout our upbringing our father and mother stand between us and God and deliver His gifts to us: God clothes us, feeds us, protects us and teaches His Word to us through our parents.

So, parents have a very high calling from God. They are called to be stewards of the greatest gift: the gift of life.

Parenting thus gives us a keen insight into all our stewardship. Parents know that they have been given a great treasure in their children, a treasure that does not belong to them, yet for which they feel a great deal of responsibility. Truth be told, every gift we have been given is like this, because everything we have — whether our own personal skills and powers or our wealth and time — is all from God. He entrusts it all to us so that we can use it all and take care of it all for His great purposes.


