

From the Pastor

Sometimes we wonder about how accurate and reliable God's Word is. Did the things recorded in the Bible really happen? Did Jesus really say and do what the Bible says?

On our recent trip to Israel, we had an interesting verification of just one small aspect of that question. We read in Matthew 11:21-24 that Jesus says, "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes. But I tell you, it will be more bearable on the day of judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You will be brought down to Hades. For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Sodom, it would have remained until this day. But I tell you that it will be more tolerable on the day of judgment for the land of Sodom than for you."

During our time in Galilee, we toured two of the three cities mentioned in this passage, Chorazin and Capernaum. True to Jesus' words, these cities were destroyed. But what is perhaps even more interesting is something our tour guide pointed out.


Not only were these cities destroyed as Jesus prophesied, but after the were destroyed, these particular cities have never been rebuilt. Our guide pointed out that many cities in history have been destroyed and rebuilt, but these three cities, Chorazin, Bethsaida, and Capernaum, were all destroyed and remain in ruins to this day. They have never been rebuilt or resettled.

God's Word is trustworthy, and what Jesus says is the truth. If that is true for the destruction and continual ruin of cities that rejected Jesus' message, how much more can we be confident that when Jesus says, "It is finished" or "Your sins are forgiven" that those statements are also true and trustworthy! God's Word and His promises are true, and they continue to this day!

ELDERS CORNER

An Elders' Corner Book Review "The 1529 Holy Week & Easter Sermons of Dr. Martin Luther"

Did you know that, in 1529, Dr. Luther preached eighteen sermons over the course of eleven days spanning Holy Week and the first week of Easter? What could he have possibly talked about over eighteen sermons?!

Here's a rough breakdown: one sermon on confession, five sermons explaining and exhorting the Lord's Supper, five sermons on various aspects of the Passion, and seven sermons on the resurrection, its aftermath, and its meaning.

This fascinating collection provides "a glimpse into what Luther actually preached to his own congregation, how he perceived their need, and how he molded the Gospel to their capacities." (Wengert, 14)

My favorite quotes from this collection of sermons are:

- 1. On confession: "Thus one may not force Christianity on you with commandments, but if you want to be a Christian or already are one, then come for the comfort!" (Luther, 32)
- 2. On the Lord's Supper: "Therefore the pope should drop the law and compulsion for those who receive the Sacrament. Instead, he does the opposite. However, you should learn what the Sacrament is and what God offers in it, and then you will come of your own accord." (Luther, 69)
- 3. On the Passion: Speaking of the torture and mockery that Jesus endured on the cross, he said, "So it shall be: every cruelty is to befall Christ and His Gospel so that Satan may pour out absolutely every evil he possesses and become powerless, much to our comfort." (Luther, 115)
- 4. On the Resurrection: "This is the true teaching of the resurrection: that each person receives the resurrection as his or her own. For there is a great difference between 'Christ is a Savior and king,' and 'Christ is my Savior and my king." (Luther, 123)
- 5. And finally, there is a quote that at first blush seems humorous but was probably fairly accurate in those days (and perhaps still today). Beginning to preach on the resurrection, he said, "...I will first read the story for the sake of the simple folk who do not know what happened on this day, in order that they may know how it turned out."

If you would like to borrow the book, it will be in the church library shortly.

Cherish What God Has Given

In the Small Catechism, Luther follows a pattern when explaining the Ten Commandments. With each commandment, there is something prohibited, and something commanded. There is something wrong which must be avoided, and there is something right which must be done. The one time this pattern is not followed is with the Sixth Commandment.

"You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other" (SC I).

Here, the catechism focuses solely on the positive: we should live in a chaste and decent manner in both word and deed, and husbands and wives should cherish and honor one another.

Keeping this commandment, and all of the commandments, is a lot easier if you see your chastity and your spouse as a gift from God that is to be protected and cherished. In the same way, you will find keeping the Fourth Commandment easier if you see your parents and other authorities as a gift from God, given to you for your blessing.

This is the key stewardship insight that runs through all of the Christian life: Everything that we have has been given to us by God. We deserve none of it. All of it comes to us by God's fatherly kindness and open-handed generosity. If I know that everything I have — every possession, every relationship, every ability — is a gift from God, then my perspective changes. All of these things are both gifts to be cherished, and things that I should direct towards God's purposes. My possessions should be shared generously according to how God has called me in my family, church and community. My spouse should be cherished, loved and encouraged in faith. My children are on loan from my own Heavenly Father, and I have but a brief time to show them the path of righteousness. My neighbor is a gift from God so that I can imitate His kindness toward me.

No matter the gift, everything has been given to me by God so that I may participate in His own goodness and open-handed generosity.




