

From the Pastor

For the last few months, I have been helping a faculty member at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis redesign one of the worship classes for future pastors. As with everything I do, I am constantly thinking about how this applies to the life of the congregation at Zion. One of the primary books used for the worship class is *Heaven on Earth: The Gifts of Christ in the Divine Service*, by Dr. Arthur Just. I would like to share some of the insights I have learned from this book with you this month.

First, think of the meaning of the title of the book itself, *Heaven on Earth: The Gifts of Christ in the Divine Service*. This suggests that when we gather for the Divine Service at Zion, to receive the Word and Sacraments, we are participating in heaven itself. I like to think of heaven as being in the presence of God, and that is exactly what happens in the Divine Service in the Word and Sacraments. Jesus comes to us. Jesus is again with His people. Being in the presence of God is being in heaven. When the Word and Sacraments are present at Zion, then Zion becomes a portal, a point of contact, with heaven itself. We see the basis for this in Scripture and in the liturgy.

John 1 provides a very clear teaching that Jesus is with us in the Word. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:1, 14). Jesus and His Word are one in a profound and real way, as John points out.

This is also taught in the liturgy, as we sing the "Gloria in Excelsis" just before the Scripture Readings in the Divine Service. The "Gloria in Excelsis" comes from Luke 2:14, the song that the angels sang to the shepherds outside Bethlehem to announce that Jesus was born. The angels sang to say that Jesus was with His people in the manger, and we sing the same song to say that Jesus is with us in the Word. God is with His people, we are in the presence of God, we are experiencing heaven on earth.

It is very clear that Jesus is with us in the Lord's Supper. Matthew records that in the Upper Room just before He was betrayed and arrested, Jesus took bread and wine and said, "Take, eat; this is My body...Drink of it, all of you, for this is My blood of the covenant" (Matthew 26:26-28). Jesus comes to be with us physically with His body and blood in the Lord's Supper.

This is also taught in the liturgy, as we sing the "Sanctus" just before we receive the Lord's Supper. The "Sanctus" comes from Isaiah 6:3 and Matthew 21:9. In Isaiah 6, the prophet is given a vision of heaven with God in His heavenly temple. Isaiah is brought into the very presence of God, and he hears the angels singing, "Holy, holy, holy Lord God of Sabaoth, heaven and earth are full of Thy glory." In the Lord's Supper, we too are brought into the physical presence of God in His earthly temple, the church, as He comes to us in bread and wine. We sing the same song in the presence of God on earth as Isaiah heard the angels singing in the presence of God in heaven.

The "Sanctus" then shifts to Matthew 21:9, which records the events of Palm Sunday. The crowds greeted Jesus entering Jerusalem with the words, "Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." We sing these same words as we recognize that Jesus comes to us, humble and lowly in bread and wine just as Jesus entered Jerusalem humble and lowly, riding on a donkey. All this points to the theological truth that in the Lord's Supper, we are enjoying a little slice of heaven on earth. God is with His people, we are in the presence of God, we are experiencing heaven on earth.

Dr. Just, in the book *Heaven on Earth: The Gifts of Christ in the Divine Service*, writes, "In worship, as God reminds the Church and the Church remembers, eternity unfolds in earthly time" (Just 227). When we remember that being in the presence of God is what heaven is all about, then we can see how special our time together in the Divine Service at Zion is each week. We are brought into the very presence of our Lord Jesus Christ in His Word and in the Lord's Supper. Jesus, as is His constant desire, comes to be with His people. God is with us, and He desires to be with us. Let us make it our focus and our highest priority to be with Him each week, to receive "the gifts of Christ in the Divine Service." There is no greater blessing and joy than to experience "heaven on earth" in the Word and Sacraments each week.



More Than a Negative

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without technically lying. You tell just enough of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing how close we can get to sinning without technically going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.





March Council meeting minutes approved by email.

Presentation by Abby McDaniel on her Girl Scout Gold Award project. Requires 80 hours of work, leading a team on a project to redo the Youth Room in the basement. Lindsay Murphy will be her mentor for the project. Abby can't accept monetary donations for the project but can accept donations of the materials for the project.  - 3. Two current teachers that partnered teaching one class will not be returning to teach this fall so will be looking for a replacement(s).
 - 4. Teacher appreciation gifts will be given to the teachers.
- Board of Education:
 - 1. Easter Egg hunt was a success. 40 children attended.
 - 2. Will purchase Visa gift cards to send to college students before Spring finals.
 - 3. VBS will held July 8-12, under the direction of Dawn Corey.
- •Youth Group: Still looking for volunteer(s) to lead Youth Group.

 - 1. 3-year-old class 17 enrolled for next year.
