

## From the Pastor

After 18 full years, actually almost 19 years, as your pastor, the time has come to say goodbye. I looked back almost 19 years to the very first few Echo articles I wrote, in September-November of 2005, and I want to share some memories and reflections with you.

I started my very first Echo article in September 2005 with these words, "I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the Gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus' (Philippians 1:3-6). While these words were originally intended from St. Paul to the Church at Philippi, they express the joy I have in you already, as we just barely begin our time together as pastor and people." Now, almost 19 years later, I can affirm the joy and the partnership in the Gospel that we have shared, and I conclude by saying "thank you" again, concluding as we began, with joy and thanksgiving to God for the time we have had together.

Then, after an introduction and thanksgiving, in the October and November 2005 Echo articles I posed the question, "What is the Church all about? Why does the Church exist? What is the PRIMARY PURPOSE of the Church?" The answers to those questions are as appropriate now at the end of my time with you as they were at the beginning of our time together almost 19 years ago. Here is what I wrote about the primary purpose of the Church back in 2005.

From the October 2005 Echo: "Let us turn to Scripture and see what is given there as the reason for the Church's existence. In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus states that the Apostles (the first pastors of the early Church) were to '...Make disciples of all nations, BAPTIZING them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, TEACHING them to obey everything I have commanded you...' (By the way, another way to translate that last portion of the passage is 'teaching them to cherish or treasure all I have entrusted to you.') What are the things that Jesus has commanded or entrusted to the Church that we are to obey and cherish? Let's turn again to Jesus' own words as recorded by St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 11: 24-25. 'This is My Body, which is for you; DO THIS in remembrance of Me...This cup is the new covenant in My Blood; DO THIS, whenever you drink it, in remembrance, of Me." Right away in the words of Christ, we see the

heart and core of the Church—the Word and Sacraments. Preaching the Gospel, Baptizing, and receiving the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in the Lord's Supper—THAT is what the Church is to be about."

In the November 2005 Echo, I moved from Christ's words in Scripture to the understanding of the Church in Lutheran Confessions, specifically the Augsburg Confession. "The Augsburg Confession states that we are saved 'by grace, for Christ's sake, through faith...' (AC IV), we are not saved by our own works or merits. The document goes on to say, 'To obtain such faith God instituted the office of the ministry, that is, provided the Gospel and the Sacraments. Through these, as through means, He gives the Holy Spirit, who works faith, when and where He pleases, in those who hear the Gospel' (AC V). God gives the office of the ministry, He sends pastors to His Church, in order to preach the Word and administer the Sacraments. That is what the pastor is to do. Of course, the pastor does other things as well, but the PRIMARY PURPOSE of the office of the ministry is to preach the Word and administer the Sacraments. The PRIMARY PURPOSE of the Church is to HEAR the Word and RECEIVE the Sacraments."

"Two paragraphs later, the Augsburg Confession includes a section entitled, 'The Church.' This section says, 'It is also taught among us that the one holy Christian Church will be and remain forever. This is the assembly of all believers among whom the Gospel is preached in its purity and the holy Sacraments are administered according to the Gospel' (AC VII). What is the Church? It is nothing other than the place where the Word is preached and the Sacraments are rightly administered. No Word, no Church. No Sacraments, no Church. Put rather bluntly, if the Word and the Sacraments are not present, then the Holy Spirit is not present to create and sustain faith in those gathered. The assembly ceases to be the Church, and instead becomes a rather useless human endeavor. On the other hand, where the Word is preached and heard in its truth and purity, where children are brought to the Font of Holy Baptism, where the faithful regularly receive the true body and blood of Jesus Christ as life-giving food, there the Holy Spirit is present and active to work His miracles of faith. May this hope and promise guide our life together in Christ's Church as we focus overwhelmingly on the PRIMARY PURPOSE, and not get bogged down in the various extra details."

Since I was looking back to the first Echo articles I wrote, I also came across the last Echo article that Pastor Schrader wrote, in August of 2005. He focused on "Delivering the Goods." He said that pastors "are to 'deliver the goods.' By that he meant the Gospel and the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion. Those are the 'goods' that every pastor is to 'deliver.' That is to be the focus of every pastor—to proclaim God's Word in its truth and purity and to faithfully administer the sacraments."

What I wrote almost 19 years ago in my introductory Echo articles, and what Pastor Schrader wrote in his farewell Echo article, is just as true today as it was then. Joining together in the Divine Service to receive God's gifts in Word and Sacraments is the primary purpose of the Church. May God continue to bless Zion in the years to come as you continue to treasure the gifts that God has entrusted to You, given in His Word, in Baptism, and in the Lord's Supper. Make it the ongoing priority of the Church to receive these gifts, and be strengthened by the Holy Spirit.

And, to conclude as we started, thank you for the joy we have shared for almost 19 years in partnership in the Gospel. I have shared God's Word and God's Sacraments with you. I have prayed with you and for you, I have shared laugher and tears with you, I have shared good times and tough times with you. I have been with you at Baptisms, Confirmations, Weddings, Funerals, and everything in between. We have been truly blessed to share almost 19 years of life together. For this we thank you, and give thanks and praise to God.

From my heart, hear the words of Numbers 6:24-26, "The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make His face shine upon you and be gracious unto you. The Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace." Amen.

#### The Power of the "Press"

(By Dan Eads)

Have you ever stopped to consider the power of the press? That is, the printing press?

I recently watched "Luther," a 2003 film about Martin Luther's life starring Joseph Fiennes. (1)

★ This movie got me thinking about the printing press, its effect on the world and on the Church,

★ and the wide variety of other tools we have available today for learning and spreading

★ knowledge of God and His gifts.

Johannes Gutenberg's printing press appeared in Europe in the 1450's and is commonly understood to have been a key tool in accelerating the Protestant Reformation. Ironically, some of the first items to be printed with it in large quantities were Roman Catholic indulgences. Indulgences and their abuse were, of course, the primary issue that Luther wished to engage in scholarly debate about with his Ninety-Five Theses -- which were themselves printed and distributed throughout Europe. (2)

As a relatively new Lutheran, I've found several tools that have helped me discover, understand, and absorb Lutheran teaching and doctrine. Whether you're a new Lutheran or a seasoned veteran, you also might find these helpful and enjoyable in your walk with God and in your understanding of Lutheranism.

#### KFUO Radio (AM 850):

The official broadcast voice of the LCMS, KFUO was my first exposure to Lutheranism. I credit it (as a tool of the Spirit) with prompting our move out of (Baptist) evangelicalism and into the LCMS.

#### The Rewards of Godliness

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God ... in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:23).

So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5–6) What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be? Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land" (Eph. 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake: "Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life" (Matt. 19:28–29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.
