# From the Pastor

### **Lutheran Normal**

Be careful how you read that title. It doesn't say "Lutheran is normal." Because it's not. This Lutheran confession of the faith is super weird (you can say "peculiar," if you want, but let's call a spade a spade). It's super weird to believe that salvation is completely God's work without any assistance or input from man. It's super weird to believe that God delivers His saving work through very tangible means, like water, word, bread, and wine. The liturgy is weird. Vestments are weird. A lectionary is weird. Singing and chanting are weird. Ordering our lives around the annual retelling of the life of Jesus is weird. It's all weird and out of sync with the rest of our lives.

And, in a world where anxiety, depression, vain ambition, selfishness, lust, greed, pride, and more are normal, I'm ok with being weird. To paraphrase Jesus, "If the world thinks you're weird, know that it thought I was weird before you. If you were normal to the world, the world would love you as its own; but because you are not normal to the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world thinks you're weird" (John 15:18-19, a paraphrase).

It should be normal to be this weird. Everyone should be Lutheran. In no other Christian confession can you have absolute certainty of your salvation. It's all God's work. He gives faith. He works through external means to save. He baptizes. He absolves. He feeds with the Body and Blood of Jesus.

I recently told Zion's catechumens that the Small Catechism's explanation of the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed exposes three common lies in popular Christianity. Against the lie that faith is my own work, some exercise of my will, the Catechism says "I believe I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ...but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith."

Against the lie that the goal of the Church is to make us good people, the Catechism says "In this Christian Church, He daily and richly forgives my sins and the sins of all believers." Good people don't need forgiveness. Who does? You know. The Church is only for sinners. And against the lie that the goal of this life is to die and go to heaven, the Catechism teaches, "On the last day, He will raise me and all the dead and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ."

You should believe that. You should confess that. You should be Lutheran, even if—maybe because—it's weird.

So what is *normal* for Lutherans then? It's easy to become myopic and think that our experience of Lutheranism must be normal. Or is it? Let's revisit a bit of the Augsburg Confession I quoted in the October Echo. The Augsburg Confession is baseline, normal Lutheranism. In fact, it's so foundational that many congregations put the letters "UAC" in their building's cornerstone. That stands for the Unaltered Augsburg Confession.

Recall these phrases, "The Mass is held among us and celebrated with the highest reverence. Nearly all the usual ceremonies are also preserved" (AC XXIV 1), and "Masses are celebrated among us every Lord's Day and on the other festivals. The Sacrament is offered to those who wish to use it, after they have been examined and absolved. And all the usual public ceremonies are observed, the series of lessons, of prayers, vestments, and other such things" (Apology XXIV 1).

In other words, when accused of doing something novel, the first generation of Lutherans said, "No, what we're doing is what the Church has always done. Here's our normal baseline: The Sacrament every Lord's Day (and other festivals), the lectionary, the liturgy, vestments, and more. And all with reverence."

We are not innovators. And the Church is built around no one's personal preferences. *Tradition* is a word from Latin means to hand something over. We receive what we've been given. In every age, what's normal in the church, has been weird, foreign, in the eyes of the world.

The earliest histories of the worship practice of the Church show a two-part service, not unlike our Divine Service. One part a service of the Word; another part the celebration of the Lord's Supper. That continued unbroken until the time of the Reformation, such that the Lutherans could say "Falsely are we accused of abolishing the Mass; the Lord's Supper is offered every Lord's Day."

Is that still the case today? Obviously not, and the question of how often the Lord's Supper should be offered has been a point of contention in Zion's recent history. And not just here. Congregations across the Synod have been asking the question, If our practice can't be described by the Lutheran confessions as "normal," why not? And a move to restore the Lord's Supper to "every Lord's Day and on other festivals" has taken hold across our church body. Though such statistics aren't kept at the Synod level, a Lutheran demographer who conducts an annual survey of Lutherans estimates that about 85% of LCMS congregations now offer the Sacrament of the Altar at least weekly. What was once normal is for most confessional Lutherans in America is becoming normal again.

But that doesn't make it any less weird. Just normal.

# Children's Christmas Program December 15, 2024







### Repenting of "Feasts that Know No Fast"

Fresh off the Christmas season and the retail frenzy that accompanies it, January brings a shot of frigid air into the lives of the people we know and love. This is not a meteorological statement either. While it is true that January is one of the colder months for those in North America, the cold front blast that hits us is the full force of credit card spending that fueled the retail frenzy. The bills for the gifts, the parties, the food and the travel have now come due. The credit card makes things convenient, but it also requires more discipline than many can muster. When the bills come in January for December's celebration, it really puts a damper on things.

Congregations often make the same mistake in stewardship. We often charge forward in doing what we always do or starting new endeavors without counting the cost. But at the end of the month, or the end of year, when the bill comes due, the red ink on the congregational balance sheet smacks the people in the face like a stiff north wind in January. We hunkered down. We circle the wagons. We start to panic. The work of the Gospel suffers.

The fifth verse of "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) addresses this January situation. The words penned by William Watkins Reid are very needful for us to hear as we start a new year, while dealing with the bills of past efforts and expense.

"Forgive us, Lord for feast that knows not fast ..." This hits us hard, doesn't it? We love when the money is flowing, the parties are going, and things are getting bigger and better. But there is a time in life, and most especially in our spiritual disciplines, that we need to fast. The purpose of a fast is to step back, lay something aside for a time, and replace it with meditation on Scripture and prayer. This is designed to keep us from turning something that may well be good into an idol that separates us from the God who loves us in Christ.

"For joy in things that meanwhile starve the soul ..." In "The Parable of the Sower," we hear Jesus talk about how the worries and cares of life choke out the growth of the seed of the Word that was planted. We know how this happens in our lives. Professional and youth sports do this. Materialism does this. Travel and leisure and do this. There is a list of things that we enjoy that starve the soul.

But it also happens in our congregations. When corporate stewardship is not managed in a responsible way, it can and does destroy individual stewardship. Is it good individual stewardship to support a ministry that doesn't take its corporate responsibility seriously?

"For walls and wars that hide your mercies vast and blur our vision of the Kingdom goal." This is the ultimate end of the idolatry of failed stewardship. We build walls between believers within the church and hamper those who are outside from coming to the Light of Life that is Jesus. The wars we fight over money and its impact on ministry do the same. It eventually blurs our vision of what we are here to do: share the Good News of Jesus. When the wintry blast of January hits us in this fashion, we are called to repent.

When the Holy Spirit uses the cold front of the call to repentance, we meet the God who forgives and restores. That is what He does for individual and corporate stewards. When the bills hit, they call us back to Jesus. He is the One who indeed forgives us our shallow thankfulness and leads us into the bounty of His mercy yet again.


