





Finding Stillness in a Season That Won't Slow Down

Stores fill with decorations, schedules with commitments, and minds packed with everything we “need” before Christmas. We move so quickly that we often forget why we are moving at all.

The story line for Christians tells a different story. Advent doesn't rush us towards things, it invites. It doesn't demand more shopping but points us toward the One who already gave everything for us. Advent draws us back to that truth—God's saving grace arriving in the most unexpected way, for this people.

Advent reminds us that slowing down is faithful.



LCMS Stewardship Ministry

“We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves” (1 Thess. 5:12-13).

Have you finished your Christmas shopping yet? Do you have a person or two on your list that you just don't know what to give them? While I know you are running short of ideas...dad doesn't really want another tie, and your kid's teacher doesn't need another coffee mug. It can be nothing short of maddening to try to figure things out in the middle of this busy season!

As stewards of all of life and life's resources, we know that life is more than giving gifts. We stewards never want to take anything the Lord provides for granted. During this season of Advent and Christmas, it is a great idea to do whatever you can to be a faithful steward of your pastor. Even more so than the rest of the year, the demands on their time, their presence and their stewardship of the Gospel in the congregation become heightened.

The demands on pastors can wear them down and wear them out. How does the steward in the congregation serve as a faithful steward of the treasure that is their pastor? Here are a few ideas:

- Put them at the top of your prayer list. – Pray that the Lord guards them against the weariness that makes them susceptible to the work of the devil.
- Make worship a priority – St. Paul admonishes the Thessalonians and us to respect those who labor among us. There is no greater way to steward your pastor than to respect him enough to show up and receive what he has been sent to offer in the proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the Holy Sacraments.
- Be receptive to his work – If your pastor is tasked with calling you to repentance or encouraging you to be in worship, know that he is only caring for your soul.
- Esteem him highly – Take the time to thank him for his faithful service to Christ, the congregation and your family.
- Be at peace – This is an easy time for even minor annoyances to get blown out of proportion and become full-blown conflict. This not only spoils the season of Advent and Christmas, but it also spoils our stewardship of the Gospel and those who serve us in that Gospel. Remember that Jesus came into the world to be the Prince of Peace. This is an act of grace and mercy. The steward seeks to reflect this toward their pastor and their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Stewardship at Christmas can be a challenge. Stewardship of your pastor during this time of the year is critical to our shared stewardship of the Gospel at a time of year when many are more open to hear and receive it.

Council Meeting Minutes
Zion Lutheran Church — November 6, 2025

Meeting called to order at 6:03 p.m. (Randy Thomsen)

Roll call: Pastor Dietrich, Bob Eldridge, Laurie Fournie, Debbie Heck, Ray Kemezys, Jon Robinson, Randy Thomsen, Lionel Timmerman, Jean Kemezys

Opening devotion and prayer (Pastor Dietrich)

Pastor's Report: (Pastor Dietrich)

Confirmation:

Confirmation continues to go well. Both the seventh and eighth grade students have now completed their first Unit Reviews. I am pleased with their learning progress and the level of engagement I continue to see in class discussions.

Preschool Ministry – “Jesus Time”:

Our preschool “Jesus Time” continues to meet weekly. Due to Parent–Teacher Conferences this week, we did not meet, but will resume next week. I plan to send out a note inviting the preschoolers to participate in our upcoming Children’s Christmas Program. It is always a blessing to see their joy and enthusiasm in learning about Jesus and singing praises in His house.

Bible Studies:

The High School Bible Study on Sunday mornings is going well. The students are attentive and ask excellent questions about their faith and the Scriptures. Consistent attendance remains an area for growth, and it would be wonderful to see this group expand in participation and depth of discussion.

The College Zoom Bible Study continues strong. Over the past month I’ve had a total of eight college check-ins—four Zoom Bible studies and four personal calls or texts to connect with our students. They remain appreciative of the ongoing care, encouragement, and prayers from our congregation.

Family and Pastoral Visits:

Since my last report, I have continued making visits as part of our “Every Family Visit” effort. To date, I have made:

- 17 family visits (still attempting to connect with Jerry Philips by phone)
- 1 prison visit
- 6 hospital visits
- 11 nursing home/assisted living visits

I plan to visit Ernie at his rehab facility tomorrow. These visits continue to be a meaningful and joyful part of my ministry, offering opportunities to share the Word of God, pray, and bring encouragement to members in various stages of life.

Advent and Christmas Preparation:

As we approach Advent and Christmas, I am preparing a congregational letter to be sent to members, lapsed members, and former members for whom we have addresses. This letter will invite them to join us for the upcoming Children’s Christmas Program and the opening of the

On Sunday, November 16, we will begin distributing our “Come Home for Christmas” yard signs and launching our intentional prayer effort for this outreach through Moosend email devotions. I’m excited to see how God will use this effort to draw hearts and homes back to His house this Christmas.


New Business:
